


MUCHINGA PROVINCE

2010 Census Final Population and Electoral Information

Population Size

The population of Muchinga Province as captured during the 2010 Census of Population and Housing was 711,657. The population in rural areas was 590,575 and 121,082 in urban areas.

Annual Rate of Population Growth

The population for Muchinga Province grew at an average rate of 3.1 percent per annum during the inter-censal period 2000-2010. Muchinga Province was created in 2011, but the growth rate has been calculated based on the districts that make up the province by adding the population of the districts as at 2000. Nakonde District was the fastest growing district with an annual rate of population growth of 4.8 percent, followed by Mafinga District at 4.6 percent per annum and Mpika District at 3.4 percent. Chinsali District had the least annual rate of population growth at 1.3 percent per annum.

Population Composition

Of the total population in the province, 49.2 percent (349,872) were males and 50.8 percent (361,785) were females. There were more females than males in both rural and urban areas. Rural areas had 50.8 percent (300,085) females compared to 49.2 percent (290,490) males, while urban areas had 51.0 percent (61,700) females compared to 49.0 percent (59,382) males.



Population Distribution

Of the 711,657 total provincial population, 83.0 percent (590,575) were in rural areas and 17.0 percent (121,082) were in urban areas.

At district level, Mpika District had the largest percentage of the total provincial population with 28.6 percent (203,379). Chinsali District was second with 20.6 percent (146,518), while Nakonde District was third with a population of 119,708, representing 16.8 percent of the provincial population. The district with the least share of the population in the province was Mafinga District with 9.3 percent (65,969).

Population Density

In 2010, the population density for Muchinga Province was 8.1 persons per square kilometer. The population density increased from 6.0 persons per square kilometer in 2000 to 8.1 persons per square kilometer in 2010, representing an increase in density of 2.1 persons per square kilometer.


The most densely populated district in the province was Nakonde District with a population density of 25.9 persons per square kilometre. This was followed by Mafinga District with 16.0 persons per square kilometer and Isoka District with 14.2 persons per square kilometer. Mpika District had the lowest population density of 5.0 persons per square kilometer.

Household Size and Composition

The total number of households in Muchinga Province as captured during the 2010 Census of Population and Housing was 138,783. Male headed households made up 78.4 percent (108,853) of the total number of households, while female headed households made up 21.6 percent (29,930).


Total Number of Households and Sex of Household Head. Muchinga Province. 2010



Green National Registration Card (NRC) Holders by District

All Zambian Citizens qualify to obtain a green National Registration Card (NRC) upon attaining the age of 16 years. In Muchinga Province, Chama District had the highest proportion of NRC holders with 84.1 percent, followed by Isoka District with 83.5 percent. Mpika District had the least proportion of NRC holders with 79.3 percent.

Percentage of Population 16 Years and Older with an NRC at the time of Census by District, Muchinga Province, 2010




Electoral Information

At the time of the Census, Muchinga Province had a total of 296,682 persons aged 18 years and above. These were eligible voters in the province. Of these, 189,189 were registered voters at the time of the census.

Mpika District had the highest percentage of registered voters at the time of the census with 26.4 percent (49,971). Chinsali District was second with 19.2 percent (36,341) of all registered voters in the province at the time of the census. Isoka District had the least percentage of registered voters at 10.2 percent (19,296).
