



Population Size

The population of Southern Province as captured during the 2010 Census of Population and Housing was 1,589,926. The population in rural areas was 1,197,751 and 392,175 in urban areas.

Annual Rate of Population Growth

The population for Southern Province grew at an average rate of 2.8 percent per annum during the inter-censal period 2000-2010. Itezhi Tezhi District was the fastest growing district with an annual rate of population growth of 4.8 percent, followed by Gwembe district at 4.5 percent per annum. Mazabuka District had the least annual rate of population growth of 1.3 percent per annum.

Population Composition

Of the total population in the province, 49.0 percent (779,659) were males and 51.0 percent (810,267) were females. There were more females than males in both rural and urban areas. Rural areas had 51.0 percent (610,303) females compared to 49.0 percent (587,448) males, while urban areas had 51.0 percent (199,964) females compared to 49.0 percent (192,211) males.



Population Distribution

Of the 1,589,926 total provincial population, 75.6 percent (1,197,751) were in rural areas and 24.4 percent (392,175) were in urban areas.

At district level, Kalomo District had the largest percentage of the total provincial population with 16.3 percent (262,344). Choma District was second with 15.6 percent (247,860), while Mazabuka District was third with 14.5 percent (230,972). The district with the least share of the population in the province was Gwembe District with 3.3 percent (53,117).

Population Density

In 2010, the population density for Southern Province was 18.6 persons per square kilometer. The population density increased from 14.2 persons per square kilometer in 2000 to 18.6 persons per square kilometer in 2010, representing an increase in density of 4.4 persons per square kilometer.

The most densely populated district in the province was Livingstone District with a population density of 200.7 persons per square kilometre. This was followed by Monze District with 39.5 persons per square kilometre. Itezhi -Tezhi District had the lowest population density of 4.3 persons per square kilometer.




Total Number of Households and Sex of Household Head, Southern Province, 2010



Green National Registration Card (NRC) Holders by District

All Zambian Citizens qualify to obtain a green National Registration Card (NRC) upon attaining the age of 16 years. In Southern Province, Livingstone District had the highest proportion of NRC holders with 87.4 percent, followed by Kazungula District with 84.9 percent. Itezhi-Tezhi District had the least proportion of NRC holders with 78.8 percent.

Percentage of Population 16 Years and Older with an NRC at the time of the Census by




Electoral Information

At the time of the Census, Southern Province had 675,974 persons aged 18 years and above. These were the eligible voters in the province. Of these, 433,601 were registered voters at the time of the census.

Choma, Kalomo and Mazabuka districts had the highest percentage share of registered voters at the time of the census with 14.7 percent each. The districts had 63,708, 63,695 and 63,660 registered voters, respectively. Gwembe District had the least percentage of registered voters at 3.6 percent (15,814).
