

## **INFLATION**

## November records lower inflation at 8.1 percent

The annual rate of inflation, as measured by the all items Consumer Price Index (CPI), reduced to 8.1 percent in November 2011 from 8.7 percent in October 2011. The decrease is mainly attributed to reductions in fuel prices.

## Changes in annual inflation rates for CPI Main Groups

Between October 2011 and November 2011, annual rates of inflation reduced for Household fuel and lighting; Furniture and household goods; Transport and communication; and Other goods and services. The annual rate of inflation increased for Food, beverages and tobacco; Clothing and footwear; Medical care; and Recreation and education.

products in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) accounted for a total of 5.3 percentage points.

## The annual Food and Non-food inflation rate

The annual food inflation rate was recorded at 6.0 percent in November 2011. This is an increase from 5.7 percent in October, 2011. Furthermore, the annual non-food inflation rate was recorded at 10.0 percent in November, 2011. This is a decrease from 11.4 percent in October 2011.

## National Average Prices of Selected Products

A comparison of retail prices between October 2011 and November 2011, shows that the national average price of a 25 kg bag of white breakfast mealie meal increased by 0.3 percent, from K48,163 to K48,309. The national average price of a 20 litre tin of maize grain increased by 4.3 percent, from K18,898 to K19,718. The average price of 1kg of tomatoes increased by 2.3 percent, from K4,002 to K4,094 while the average price of 1kg of dried kapenta (Mpulungu) increased by 18.5 percent, from K56,841 to K67,384.


## October 2011 records Trade Surplus

Zambia recorded a trade surplus valued at K187.5 Billion in October 2011, from K1,179.0 Billion recorded in September 2011. This means that the country exported more in October 2011 than it imported, in the same month, in nominal terms. Since January 2011 the country has had monthly trade surpluses with the highest valued at K1,484.3 Billion recorded in January 2011, followed by K1,179 Billion in September 2011 and the lowest in October 2011, valued at K187.5 Billion.

## Exports by Major Product Categories, October and September 2011

Zambia's major export products in October 2011 were from the Intermediate goods category (mainly comprising copper cathodes and sections of refined copper) accounting for about 81.5 percent. Other exports were from the Consumer goods, Raw materials and Capital goods categories; which collectively accounted for about 18.5 percent of total exports in October 2011. This implies that between October and September 2011, the country has been a net exporter of Intermediate goods, mainly Metals and their articles, accounting for an average of 72.9 percent of the total exports for the two months.

## Zambia's Metal Exports and Non-Traditional Exports (NTEs), October and September 2011

There has been a decrease in the total value of exports from K4,656.8 billion to K3,369.1 billion between September and October 2011. The overall contribution of Metals and their products to the total export earnings in October and September 2011 averaged about 67.2 percent. The share of NTEs recorded an average of about 32.8 percent in revenue earnings between October and September 2011.



## Zambia's Major Export Destinations by Commodity in October 2011

Zambia's major export destination in October 2011 was Switzerland, which accounted for 40.8 percent. The major export products to Switzerland were Cathodes & Sections of Cathodes of refined Copper accounting for about 84.8 percent.

China was the second major destination of Zambia's exports accounting for 20.3 percent. The major export product to China was Copper blister (53.6 percent).

South Africa was the third major export destination accounting for 9.8 percent. The main export products to South Africa were Cathodes & Sections of Cathodes of refined Copper which contributed 23.2 percent to the country's share of exports. The Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) was the fourth major destination of Zambia's exports accounting for 6.1 percent. The major export products to DRC were Sulphur, sublimed or precipitated, which accounted for 11.9 percent.

The fifth major export destination, was Singapore which accounted for 0.4 percent. The main export product to Singapore was Cotton, not carded or combed (96.1 percent).

These five countries collectively accounted for 71.2 percent of Zambia's total export earnings in October 2011.

## Export Market Shares by Regional Groupings, October and September 2011

The Southern African Development Community (SADC) regional grouping was the largest market for Zambia's total exports, accounting for 28.2 percent in October 2011. Within SADC, South Africa was the dominant market in October 2011 with 34.6 percent, while Congo (DR) was the dominant market in September 2011 with 45.4 percent. Other notable markets in October 2011 were Zimbabwe, Mozambique and Malawi.

Asia was the second largest market for Zambia's total exports, accounting for 21.5 percent in October 2011. Within Asia, China was the dominant market in October 2011 with 94.1 percent. Singapore was the second dominant market in October 2011 with only 2 percent. Other markets were India, Hong Kong and The United Arab Emirates. The Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) grouping of countries was the third largest market for Zambia's total exports accounting for 13.6 percent in October 2011. Within COMESA, Congo (DR) was the dominant market with 45.2 percent in October 2011. Zimbabwe was the second dominant market in October 2011 with 24.5 percent. Other notable markets were Malawi, Kenya and Mauritius.

The European Union (EU) was the fourth largest market for Zambia's total exports accounting for 7.5 percent in October 2011. Within the EU, the United Kingdom was the dominant market with 61.3 and 83.7 percent in October and September 2011, respectively. Belgium was the second dominant market in both months with 17.8 percent in October 2011 and 9.2 percent in September 2011. Other notable markets were Luxembourg, Germany and Netherlands.

## Imports by Major Product Categories, October and September 2011

Zambia's major import products by category in October 2011 were Intermediate goods, accounting for 38.6 percent. The Capital goods category was second with 30.4 percent, followed by Raw materials with 16.2 percent. Consumer goods were fourth with 14.9 percent. Between October and September 2011, the country has been a net importer of Intermediate goods, contributing an average of 38.6 percent to total imports in both months.

## Zambia's Major Import Sources by Commodity, October 2011

The major source of Zambia's imports in October 2011 was South Africa, accounting for 39.5 percent. The major import products from South Africa were Sulphur, sublimed or precipitated, contributing 3.1 percent to the share of imports.

The second main source of Zambia's imports in October 2011 was Congo (DR), accounting for 17.4 percent of the total

value of imports. The major import products to Congo DR were Copper ores and concentrates, accounting for 58.0 percent.

Other sources of Zambia's imports were China, United Arab Emirates and India which collectively accounted for 18.2 percent of Zambia's total imports in October 2011.

### Import Market Shares by Regional Groupings, October and September 2011

The Southern African Development Community (SADC) regional grouping was the largest source of Zambia's imports accounting for 60.9 percent, in October 2011. Within SADC, South Africa was the major source of Zambia's imports with 64.8 percent in October 2011 and 67.5 percent in September 2011. Congo (DR) was the second major source of Zambia's imports with 28.5 and 26.7 percent in October and September 2011, respectively. Other notable markets were Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Namibia and Mauritius.

Asia was the second largest source of Zambia's imports accounting for 24.0 percent in October 2011. Within Asia, China was the dominant source of Zambia's imports in October with 33.2 percent while Kuwait was the dominant source in September 2011 with 34.6 percent. The United Arab Emirates was second with 25.8 percent in October 2011, while China was second in September 2011 with 31.0 percent. Other notable markets were India, Singapore and Japan.

The Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) grouping of countries was the third largest source of Zambia's imports accounting for 21.2 October 2011. Within percent in COMESA, Congo (DR) was the main source of Zambia's imports in both October and September 2011 with 81.8 and 80.9 percent, respectively. Zimbabwe was the second largest source in October 2011. Other prominent sources were Mauritius and Egypt.

The European Union (EU) was the fourth largest source of Zambia's imports accounting for 8.3 percent in October 2011. Within the EU, the United Kingdom was the major source of Zambia's imports accounting for 30.5 and 31.2 percent in October and September 2011. respectively. Germany was second in October 2011 with 15.8 percent, while Finland ranked second in September 2011 with 18.0 percent. Other notable markets were Netherlands, Ireland and France.
