

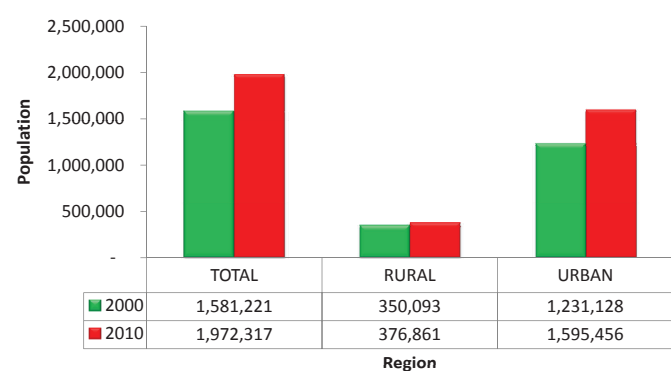

2010 Census Final Population and Electoral Information

Population Size

The population of Copperbelt Province as captured during the 2010 Census of Population and Housing was 1,972,317. The population in rural areas was 376,861 and 1,595,456 in urban areas.

Annual Rate of Population Growth

The population for Copperbelt Province grew at an average rate of 2.2 percent per annum during the inter-censal period 2000-2010. Mpongwe District was the fastest growing district with an annual rate of population growth of 3.8 percent, followed by Kitwe District at 3.2 percent per annum and Chililabombwe District at 3.1 percent. Luanshya District had the least annual rate of population growth at 0.5 percent per annum.

Population Composition

Of the total population in the province, 49.8 percent (981,887) were males and 50.2 percent (990,430) were females. There were more females than males in urban areas and more males than females in rural areas. Urban areas had 50.4 percent (803,747) females compared to 49.6 percent (791,709) males; while rural areas had 50.5 percent (190,178) males compared to 49.5 percent (186,683) females.

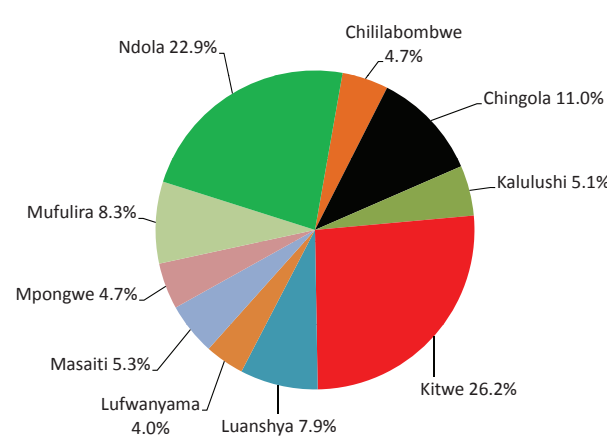

Population Distribution

Of the 1,972,317 total population in the province, 19.1 percent (376,861) were in rural areas and 80.9 percent (1,595,456) were in urban areas.

At district level, Kitwe District had the largest percentage of the total population with 26.2 percent (517,543). Ndola District was second with 22.9 percent (451,246), while Chingola District was third with a population of 216,626, representing 11.0 percent. The district with the least share of the population in the province was Lufwanyama District with 4.0 percent (78,503).

Population Density

In 2010, the population density for Copperbelt Province was 63.0 persons per square kilometre. The population density increased from 50.5 persons per square kilometer in 2000 to 63.0 persons per square kilometer in 2010, representing an increase in density of 12.5 persons per square kilometer.

The most densely populated district in the province was Kitwe District with a population density of 666.1 persons per square kilometre. This was followed by Ndola District with 409.1 persons per square kilometer and Kalulushi District was third with a population density of 138.5 persons per square kilometre. Lufwanyama District had the lowest population density of 8.0 persons per square kilometer.

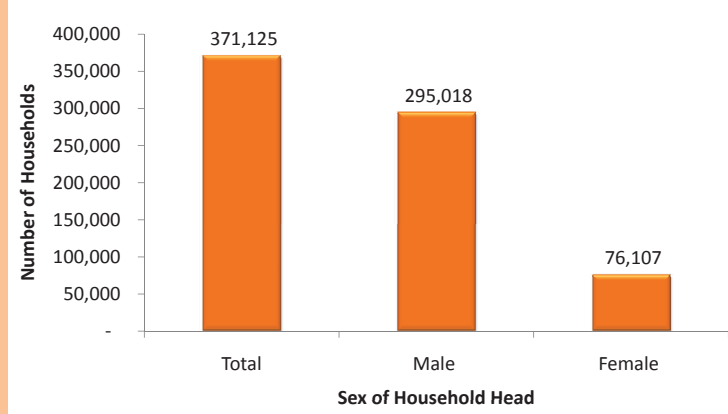

Household Size and Composition

The total number of households in Copperbelt Province as captured during the 2010 Census of Population and Housing was 371,125. Male headed households made up 79.5 percent (295,018) of the total number of households, while female headed households made up 20.5 percent (76,107).

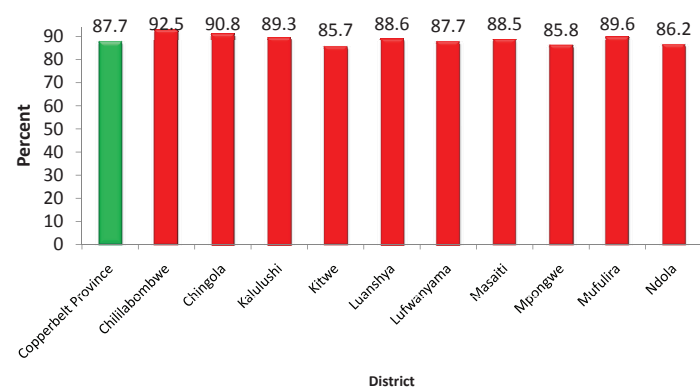
Total Number of Households and Sex of Household Head, Copperbelt Province, 2010



Green National Registration Card (NRC) Holders by District

All Zambian Citizens qualify to obtain a green National Registration Card (NRC) upon attaining the age of 16 years. In Copperbelt Province, Chililabombwe District had the highest proportion of NRC holders with 92.5 percent followed by Chingola District with 90.8 percent. Kitwe District had the least proportion of NRC holders with 85.7 percent.

Percentage of Population 16 Years and Older with an NRC at the time of the Census by District, Copperbelt Province, 2010

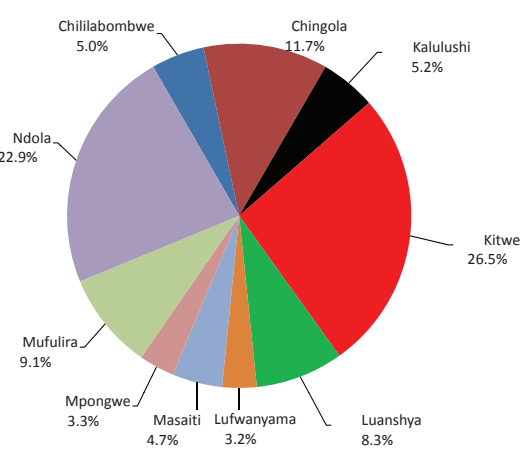


Electoral Information

At the time of the Census, Copperbelt Province had 971,599 persons aged 18 years and above. These were eligible voters in the province. Of these, 642,210 were registered voters at the time of the census.

Kitwe District had the highest percentage of registered voters at the time of the census with 26.5 percent (170,110). Ndola District was second with 22.9 percent (147,017) of all registered voters in the province. The rest of the districts in the province had less than 10 percent share of registered voters with the least being Lufwanyama District at 3.2 percent (20,737).
