
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

YEAR ON YEAR INFLATION RATE FOR SEPTEMBER 2018 DECREASES TO 7.9 PERCENT

The year on year inflation rate as measured by the all items Consumer Price Index (CPI) for September 2018 decreased to 7.9 percent from 8.1 percent recorded in August 2018. This means that on average, prices of goods and services increased by 7.9 percent between September 2017 and September 2018.

The decrease in the annual rate of inflation is mainly attributed to Electricity due to the base effect arising from the adjustment in electricity tariffs in September, 2017

YEAR ON YEAR FOOD AND NON-FOOD INFLATION RATE

The year on year (Annual) food inflation rate for September 2018 was recorded at 8.6 percent compared to 8.3 percent recorded in August 2018 indicating an increase of 0.3 percentage points. The increase in the annual food inflation rate is mainly as a result of price changes of Breakfast Mealie meal, Roller Meal and Maize Grain.

The year on year (Annual) non-food inflation rate for September 2018 was recorded at 7.3 percent from 7.8 percent recorded in August 2018, indicating a decrease of 0.5 percentage points. The decrease is mainly attributed to Electricity due to the base effect arising from the adjustment in electricity tariffs in September, 2017.

ANNUAL INFLATION RATE MOVEMENT BY CPI MAIN GROUP

CPI MAIN GROUPS THAT INCREASED

The annual rate of inflation for September increased for;

1. Food and Non-alcoholic beverages

The annual rate of inflation for the Food and non-alcoholic beverages CPI main group increased from 8.3 in August 2018 to 8.6 in September 2018. The increase is mainly attributed to price changes in Breakfast mealie meal; Roller Meal, Maize grain and Sorghum.

2. Furnishing, Household Equipment and Household Maintenance

The annual rate of inflation for the Furnishing, Household Equipment and Household Maintenance CPI main group increased from 5.6 in August 2018 to 6.8 in September 2018. The increase is mainly attributed to price changes in Bar soap, Disinfectant Harpic Guard and Blanket.

3. Health

The annual rate of inflation for the Health CPI main group increased from 4.1 in August 2018 to 5.0 in September 2018. The increase is mainly attributed to price changes in Cough syrup, Aspirin, Cafenol and Fansidar.

4. Transport

The annual rate of inflation for the Transport CPI main group increased from 12.3 in August 2018 to 13.5 in September 2018. The increase is mainly attributed to price changes in Purchase of vehicles, Air fare domestic and Lusaka/London via Dubai.

5. Recreation and Culture

The annual rate of inflation for the Recreation and Culture CPI main group increased from 7.0 in August 2018 to 8.3 in September 2018. The increase is mainly attributed to price changes in School exercise books, Dictionary, Magazine, CD Blank and Football.

6. Education

The annual rate of inflation for the Education CPI main group increased from 3.5 in August 2018 to 3.6 in September 2018. The increase is mainly attributed to price changes in College fees.

7. Restaurant and Hotel

The annual rate of inflation for the Restaurant and Hotel CPI main group increased from 3.2 in August 2018 to 4.4 in September 2018. The increase is mainly attributed to price changes in Cold Beer restaurant, Soft Drink restaurant and Chicken and chips takeaway.

CPI MAIN GROUPS THAT DECREASED

The annual inflation rate for September reduced for;

1. Alcoholic beverages and tobacco

The inflation rate for the Alcoholic beverages and tobacco CPI main group reduced from 5.0 in August 2018 to 4.5 in September 2018. The decrease is mainly attributed to the price changes for Eagle lager and Chibuku from Tarven.

2. Clothing and Footwear

The inflation rate for the Clothing and Footwear CPI main group reduced from 6.9 in August 2018 to 6.6 in September 2018. The decrease is mainly attributed to the price changes for Ladies leather shoes and Boys school shoes.

3. Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas, and Other Fuels

The inflation rate for the Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas, and Other Fuels CPI main group reduced from 9.5 in August 2018 to 6.4 in September 2018. The decrease is mainly attributed to the price changes for electricity due to the base effect and firewood.

4. Miscellaneous goods and services

The inflation rate for the Miscellaneous goods and services CPI main group reduced from 8.4 in August 2018 to 7.9 in September 2018. The decrease is mainly attributed to the price changes for Hammer milling charge and Hair plaiting.

CPI MAIN GROUPS THAT REMAINED THE SAME

The annual rate of inflation remained the same for Communication at 2.7 for August and September.

Of the total 7.9 percent annual inflation rate recorded in September 2018, Food and Non-alcoholic beverages accounted for 4.5 percentage points, while non-food items accounted for a total of 3.4 percentage points.



SEPTEMBER 2018 MONTH ON MONTH INFLATION RATE DECREASES TO 0.2 PERCENT

The month on month (monthly) inflation rate for September 2018, was recorded at 0.2 percent indicating a decrease of 0.1 percentage point compared to 0.3

percent recorded in August 2018. The decrease is mainly attributed to samp, bread flour and cassava meal.

MONTH ON MONTH INFLATION RATE: FOOD AND NON-FOOD ITEMS

The month on month (Monthly) food inflation rate for September 2018 decreased to 0.1 percent compared to 0.3 percent recorded in August 2018. The decrease in the month on month food inflation rate is mainly as a result of bread flour, samp and cassava meal. The month on month (monthly) Non Food inflation rate for September 2018 was recorded at 0.3 percent, same as the one recorded in August 2018.

PROVINCIAL ANNUAL INFLATION RATES

Provincial changes in annual inflation rate show that between September 2017 and September 2018, Northern Province had the highest annual rate of inflation at 12.2 percent followed by Lusaka province at 9.2 percent. Copperbelt Province recorded the lowest annual rate of inflation at 5.9 percent.

PROVINCIAL CONTRIBUTION TO OVERALL INFLATION

Lusaka Province had the highest provincial contribution of 2.6 percentage points to the overall annual inflation rate of 7.9 percent recorded in September 2018. This implies that the price movements in Lusaka Province had the greatest influence on the overall annual rate of inflation. Copperbelt Province had the second highest provincial contribution of 1.3 percentage points while Luapula, North Western and Western provinces had the lowest contribution of 0.3 percentage points each.

On a monthly basis, a comparison of retail prices between August 2018 to September 2018 shows that the national average price of a 25 kg bag of Breakfast Mealie meal increased by 1.34 percent from K79.39 to 80.45 while the national average price of a 25 kg bag of Roller Mealie meal increased by 2.72 percent from K56.98 to K58.53. The national average price of a 20 litre tin of Maize grain increased by 4.55 percent from K30.54 to K31.93.

On an annual basis, a comparison of retail prices between August 2017 and September 2018 shows that the national average price of a 25kg bag of Breakfast Mealie meal increased by 11.74 percent from K72.00 to K80.45. The national average price of a 20 litre tin of Maize grain increased by 9.73 percent from K29.10 to K31.93.

INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE

August 2018 records a Trade Deficit

Zambia's trade deficit increased by 109.7 percent from K829 Million recorded in July 2018 to K1,738.2 Million in August 2018. This trade deficit means that the country imported more than it exported in nominal terms. Imports increased by 14.0 percent from K8,877.4 Million in July 2018 to K10,117.8 Million in August 2018, this increase is mainly attributed to the increase in the imports of Capital Goods by 39.7 percent from K2,672.9

Million in July 2018 to K 3,732.8 Million in August 2018. Exports increased by 4.1 percent from K8,048.5 Million in July 2018 to K8,379.6 Million in August 2018. The increase in the value of exports is mainly attributed to the increase in the Consumer goods exports and Capital goods exports by 40.4 percent and 23.0 percent respectively. Therefore, the increase in the trade deficit is due to the increase in imports outweighing that of exports

Performance of Exports (Traditional and Non-Traditional Exports (TEs and NTEs)), August 2018 and July 2018

The Traditional Export earnings decreased by 1.8 percent from K6,049.9 Million in July 2018 to K5,941.9 Million in August 2018. The share of TEs recorded an average of 73.1 percent in revenue earnings between August 2018 and July 2018.

Non-Traditional Exports (NTEs) increased by 22.0 percent from K1,998.6 Million in July 2018 to K2,437.6 Million in August 2018. The share of NTEs recorded an average of 27.0 percent in revenue earnings between August 2018 and July 2018


Zambia's Exports of Copper by Volume and corresponding LME prices, August 2018 and July 2018

The volume of Copper exported in August 2018 increased by 3.4 percent from 90,410 metric tonnes in July 2018 to 93,466 metric tonnes in August 2018.

The Copper prices on LME market for the corresponding months decreased by 3.3 percent, from \$6,248 per metric tonne in July 2018 to \$6,040 per metric tonne in August 2018.

Since Copper accounts for the largest weight/ proportion of Traditional Exports, any change in the volume and price/value has a direct bearing on the performance of Traditional Exports.

Performance of Non-Traditional Exports (NTEs), August 2018 and July 2018

For the purpose of this analysis, Non-Traditional Exports are divided into Agricultural and Non-Agricultural products.

Agricultural Products

Agricultural products accounted for a share of 33.3 percent of Zambia's Non-Traditional Exports (NTEs) in August 2018 compared to 31.9 percent recorded in July 2018.

The export earnings from Agricultural products recorded a 27.4 percent increase from K637.6 Million in July 2018 to K812.3 Million in August 2018. The major export commodities were 'Cotton, not carded or combed' (16.2 percent), 'Tobacco partly or wholly stemmed/stripped' (13.3 percent) and 'Oilcake and other solid residues of soya bean' (10.3 percent).

Non-Agricultural Products

Non-Agricultural products accounted for a share of 66.7 percent of Zambia's Non-Traditional Exports (NTEs) in August 2018 compared to 68.1 percent recorded in July 2018.

The export earnings from Non-Agricultural products recorded an increase of 19.4 percent from K1,361.0 Million in July 2018 to K1,625.3 Million in August 2018. The major

export commodities were 'Articles of stone or other mineral substances, nes' (11.3 percent), 'Sulphuric acid; oleum in bulk' (8.4 percent) and 'Wire of refined copper, maximum crosssectional dimension >6mm' (5.1 percent).



Exports by Major Product Categories, August 2018 and July 2018

Zambia's major export products in August 2018 were from the intermediate goods category (mainly comprising Copper anodes for electrolytic refining and Cathodes of refined copper) accounting for 80.7 percent. Exports from the Consumer goods, Raw Materials and Capital goods categories, collectively accounted for 19.3 percent of Total exports in August 2018.

Zambia's Major Export Destinations by Commodity in August 2018

The major export destination in August 2018 was Switzerland, which accounted for 39.0 percent of the total export earnings. The main export product to Switzerland was Copper anodes for electrolytic refining, accounting for 53.6 percent of total export earnings from that country, followed by Cathodes and sections of cathodes of refined copper (10.2 percent).

China was the second main destination of Zambia's exports accounting for 18.6 percent of the total export earnings. The main export product to China was Copper anodes for electrolytic refining, accounting for 61.0 percent of total export earnings from that Country. Congo DR was the third main export destination accounting for 9.3 percent of the total export earnings. The main export product was Sulphuric acid; oleum in bulk accounting for 17.7 percent of total export earnings from that country.

The fourth main export destination was Singapore, which accounted for 7.5 percent of the total export earnings. The main export products were Electro-won copper cathodes (High Purity), accounting for 45.0 percent of total export earnings from that country.

South Africa was the fifth main export destination accounting for 4.5 percent of the total export earnings. The main export product

These five countries collectively accounted for 78.9 percent of Zambia's total export earnings in August 2018.

Export Market Shares by selected Regional Groupings and Major Trading Partners, August 2018 and July 2018

Switzerland was the largest market for Zambia's total exports in August 2018, accounting for 39.0 percent.

Asia was the second largest market for Zambia's total exports, accounting for 29.5 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, China was the dominant market with 63.2 percent. Other notable markets in this grouping were Singapore, Hong Kong, India and Japan.

The DUAL-SADC & COMESA grouping was the third largest market for Zambia's total exports, accounting for 12.2 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, Congo DR was the dominant market, accounting for 75.6 percent. Other notable markets in this grouping were Zimbabwe, Malawi, Mauritius and Swaziland.

The European Union grouping was the fourth largest market for Zambia's total exports,

accounting for 10.3 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, The United Kingdom was the dominant market with 93.9 percent. Other notable markets in this grouping were Germany, Belgium, Italy and France.

The SADC exclusive grouping was the fifth largest market for Zambia's total exports, accounting for 5.7 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, South Africa was the dominant market with 78.1 percent. Other notable markets within this grouping were Tanzania, Botswana, Mozambique and Namibia.

The COMESA exclusive grouping was the sixth largest market for Zambia's total exports, accounting for 1.9 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, Kenya was the dominant market with 71.4 percent. Other notable markets were Burundi, Rwanda, Uganda and Djibouti.



Imports by Major Product Categories August 2018 and July 2018

The major import products by Major product category in August 2018 were Capital goods category, accounting for 36.9 percent. The Intermediate goods category was second with 26.5 percent, followed by the Consumer goods and Raw materials Categories, accounting for 20.9 percent and 15.7 percent respectively.

Zambia's Major Import Sources by Product in August 2018

The major source of imports in August 2018 was Congo DR, accounting for 26.5 percent. The major import products were Cobalt oxides and hydroxides; commercial cobalt oxides in bulk, accounting for 46.0 percent of the import bill from that country.

The second main source was South Africa, accounting for 25.8 percent. The major import products were Vehicles with only spark-ignition engine of cylinder capacity 1500-3000cc - Ambulances, which accounted for 5.3 percent of the import bill from that country.

China was the third main source of Zambia's imports, accounting for 10.3 percent. The major import products were Road tractors for semi-trailers accounting for 8.4 percent of the import bill from that country.

Other main sources of Zambia's imports were Kuwait and United Arab Emirates, which collectively accounted for 9.6 percent of Zambia's imports.

Import Market Shares by Selected Regional Groupings and major trading partners August 2018 and July 2018

The SADC exclusive grouping was the largest source of Zambia's imports, accounting for 30.2 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, South Africa was the dominant market with 85.5 percent. Other notable markets were Mozambique, Tanzania, Namibia and Botswana.

Asia was the second largest source of Zambia's imports, accounting for 30.0 percent in August 2018. Within this regional grouping, China was the main source of Zambia's imports accounting for 34.4 percent. Other notable markets were Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, India and Korea DPR (North).

The Dual SADC & COMESA grouping was the third largest source of Zambia's imports accounting for 29.2 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, Congo DR was the main source of Zambia's imports accounting for 90.9 percent. Other notable markets were Mauritius, Zimbabwe, Swaziland and Malawi.

The European Union (EU) was the fourth largest source of Zambia's imports accounting for 6.3 percent. Within this grouping, The United Kingdom was the main source of Zambia's imports with 30.4 percent. Other notable markets were Germany, Sweden, Belgium and Netherlands.

The COMESA exclusive grouping was the fifth largest source for Zambia's imports accounting for 0.6 percent in August 2018. Within this grouping, Kenya was the dominant market with 78.8 percent. Other notable markets were Egypt, Uganda, Rwanda and Burundi.
